Where To Now?

The official launch on 28 September 2010 of the Botanic Gardens was a most memorable and enjoyable event—if a little chilly in the spring wind. We now commence a very exciting phase with detailed planning underway to create a world-class botanic garden.

This planning begins with the Plan of Management (POM), which is currently being finalised. The Council anticipates the POM will be placed on public display for four weeks early in the New Year. The final revised version will be considered for adoption as early as March 2011. As soon as Council formally adopts the POM, another important stage will commence when we start the site development for the Botanic Gardens.

In the meantime we will be preparing the Design Master Plan for the Botanic Gardens, the business plan and undertaking more fundraising so we can finance the physical works early next year.

Our first project will be to erect a fence along Old South and Kangaloon Roads. Hopefully planting will commence in earnest as the weather cools for autumn.

The State MP for Goulburn, Ms Pru Goward, and the Mayor of Wingecarribee Shire Council, Ken Halstead, joined the Governor on the dais and following the speeches each of them planted a tree.

Operculum: A rose by any other name . . .

A number of people have asked us recently why this Newsletter is called *Operculum*. The explanation for the title was originally given in volume 1, issue 1 (December 2006).

An operculum is the little covering flap or cap in a Eucalypt flower bud, which is formed from the fused petals and sepals. When the cap comes off the 'flower' appears with the unfurling of the stamen. Just like that little cap in a Eucalypt flower bud, this newsletter will reveal the latest news and activities of the Botanic Gardens as they unfurl.
